

CURRENT AFFAIRS

Manas National Park

Assam is one of the 8th North-Eastern states of India known for rich wildlife sanctuary and abundant of natural settings. There are fiveNational Parks and eighteen Wildlife Sanctuaries along with several Forest Reserves. These vast jungles of the state are abode of some of the beautiful flora and fauna. Moreover, Assam is home to two important and world famous UNESCO World Heritage Sites – Manas National Park and most popular Kaziranga National Park. Manas National Park has drawn the attention of nature enthusiasts in recent years and has left its presence in the tourist map of the globe with thousands of tourists visiting the park every year.



Manas National Park or Manas Wildlife Sanctuary located in Assam is a UNESCO World Heritage Site, a Project Tiger Reserve, An Elephant Reserve as well as Biosphere Reserve. Unique in all respects, this legendry park is an abode of numerous species of fauna like Asiatic Elephant, Tiger, Indian One Horned Rhinoceros, Leopards, Barking Deers, Hoolock Gibbons and many more to list. Manas National Park have an unique identity that makes it very different from the other wildlife sanctuaries of the world that it is a home to some of highly rare and endangered wildlife species such as **Red Panda, Pygmy Hog, Golden Langur, the Hispid Hare and the Assam Roofed Top Turtle. Indian tigers and Asiatic Water Buffalo are also found here.** Situated 180 kilometer away from Guwahati, the area of Manas National Park is near Manas River which is one of the major tributaries of River Brahmaputra.



Mayurbhanja Chapter

The Chapter has taken up a step to do Videography on Cultural Heritage of Adibasies (Santhali) in order to revive the ancient, 'DASAIN DANCE' which was the source of enjoyment of the Santhalies at the time of their leisure i.e. during Durga puja. This dance is based on a story. "The Adibasies were living in remote corner of forest & hilly side at the time of Mugol's Rule. The Mugal people crooked by nature saw two beautiful young adibasi girls - Inom & Kajal. For the daily work the two girls were going to nearby river. One day the Mugals kidnapped those two girls by the help of a naughty man of that village. The news was spread throughout the village. The villagers congregated in an open place and took the advice of a Guru (Learned man). After offering Puja to their Deity the villagers started in disguise of women to search the two girls through dancing and singing & were begging from door to door to find out the girls. They were using Bhuyang, Flute, Bell etc as their orchestra. They had kept their weapons inside their costumes. They could not find those girls". Till date this typical dance has been continuing during Durgapuja. This story and dance depict the tradition of Guru puja and Unity of adibasies especially Santali community of Mayurbhanj, Keonjhar & other Tribal District of Odisha.

Her mother had donated all her ornaments to Gandhi ji on that occasion. She narrated how they were all influenced by Gandhi ji's associates whom they met while visiting Sabarmati Ashram. 
